Sermon Title: "THE CHURCH AT CORINTH" - Part 2

Date: November 12, 2023 - Acts 18:9-23

Central Idea: Be faithful in your commitments and leave the problems to God. Are you being faithful, and do you leave your problems with God?

Introduction: While Paul, with the help of Silas and Timothy, devoted himself fully to the preaching and teaching of the gospel, the opposition from the Jews became increasingly powerful. Discouragement and fear became Paul's companions and hindered him in his ministry. Like many other saints who had preceded him, Paul needed a word of encouragement.
