## Sermon Title: "THE SERVANT'S SATISFACTION" Date: March 31, 2024 - Isaiah 53:10-12

Central Idea: The servant was crushed at the cross, but was victorious at the resurrection. Are you experiencing the resurrection miracle?

## Introduction:

The prophet now explains the cross from God's point of view. Even though Jesus was crucified by the hands of wicked men, His death was determined beforehand by God (Acts 2:22-23). Jesus was not a martyr, nor was His death an accident. He was God's sacrifice for the sins of the world.

How did God solve the sin problem? The Judge took the place of the criminals and met the just demands of His own holy law!

  - 2. Satisfied

## Conclusion:

Consider the pictures of the Savior: a beaten servant (Isaiah 52:13-14), a root (Isaiah 53:2), an innocent lamb (v. 7), an offering for sin (v. 10), a woman in travail giving birth to spiritual "seed" (vv. 10-11), and a victorious general (v. 12). Hallelujah, what a Savior!

Yet people still do not believe in Him (v.1). Instead, they despise and reject Him (v. 2) and laugh at the message of the Cross (1Cor. 1:18-25). But heaven praises the Lamb of God (Rev. 5), and His people on earth glory in His cross (Gal. 6:14). Are you among them?
