Sermon Title: PETER—THE APOSTLE WITH THE FOOT-SHAPED MOUTH

Date: June 16, 2024 - Luke 6:13-16; Luke 22:31-32

Central Idea: We must obey Jesus, even when His commands don't seem to make sense. Do you make a practice of obeying Jesus?

Introduction:

Peter was genuinely human. That is good! He was always himself; he never pretended. Peter had gifts of leadership, and he had something that we call personality. Another quality we like about Peter is his wholeheartedness. He was sometimes on the wrong side of the fence, sometimes on the right side, but he never straddled it.
