Central Idea: God can weave even human wickedness into His sovereign plan of salvation. Have you seen that in your own experience in the past? Introduction:

Since the Jews were unable to execute anyone themselves, they needed the Roman governor's help. They would have killed the Lord then, but there was a problem: the Romans had conquered Israel, and because the Jews were under Roman occupation, they could not carry out a death sentence themselves. Only Rome could do that. In the present chapter, we have the full revelation of the characters of those associated with Christ's trial.
