THE WORD WITH GOD

Date: October 12, 2025 - Jonah 1:17-2:10

Central Idea: Prayer demonstrates running to God for help. Do you run to God in times of need?

Introduction:

When God calls us for a mission, we should run to Him in prayer. It is sad when we put off prayer and often wait too late. But God is gracious and merciful. Praise God for forgiveness!

Warren Wiersbe said, "How did Jonah get into all that trouble? He forgot God, neglected prayer (v. 3), and believed lies (v. 8). He learned the hard way that he could not escape God's will. But he was wise enough to run back to God and ask for forgiveness!"
