Date: November 9, 2025 - Psalm 23:1-6

Central Idea: We need to trust the authority of scripture as our rule of faith and behavior. Are you trusting God's word?

Introduction:

Three thousand years have passed since the psalmist David first sang the words of the twenty-third Psalm. Yet, this psalm is still as fresh as the day it was composed. Its ancient words are among the first that many of us learned as children. They are often among the last that we whisper to loved ones who lie in the darkness of life waiting for the daybreak of heaven. Only God Himself knows how often the 23rd Psalm has encouraged those who were dying and comforted those who were left behind.
