PSALM 23

Date: November 16, 2025 - Psalm 23:1-6

Central Idea: Our Divine Shepherd is always there to protect and guide us. Are you following the Shepherd?

Introduction: No Psalm has gained more admirers than Psalm 23. In it, we learn not only about God's nature but also about His loving leadership. David describes the Lord as a Shepherd, no doubt seeing Him this way because of His own leadership bias. David also had been a model shepherd. David is telling us that this leadership grows out of a personal relationship. Some consider verse 4 as the central verse of this Psalm. Notice that the personal pronoun changes from "he" to "you." David is not speaking about the Shepherd but speaking to the Shepherd.

- -Corrects and Comforts, v. 4
- -Feeds and Anoints, v. 5
