Date: November 30, 2025 - Psalm 19:7-10

Central Idea: “If your heart is right with God and others, prayer can flow directly from your heart.” Are you right with God and others?

Introduction: “Prayer is personal. Completely unique. Yet even with this much freedom involved, God does provide powerful resources to help us pray strategically and specifically to help you know for certain that your heart is beating in step with God’s.” (Kendrick, Stephen and Alex. *The Battle Plan for Prayer*, p. 125).

A.C.T.S.

A—Adoration—1 Chronicles 29:11, 12

C—Confession—Psalm 51:10, 12

T—Thanksgiving—Psalm 118:1, 21

S—Supplication—Psalm 84:8, 11

Conclusion: “The Psalms, as you can tell, are a great place to start and a rich treasury of prayers and praise. But expect the Lord to illuminate His thoughts toward you from one end of the Bible to the other. Instead of just viewing it as reading material, open your heart to receive it also as prayer material. When you don’t know what to say, let the Bible lead your praying for you.” (*The Battle Plan for Prayer*, p. 129).
